

## **REGULATIONS FOR THE AIJISA YOUNG PRESENTATION AWARD**

(Formed by the Research Committee on Information Systems Technology of AIJ, August 8, 2019)

### **OBJECTIVE**

1. The aim of the AIJISA Young Presentation Award is to acknowledge and encourage research on computer-based information technology in architectural engineering.

### **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

2. The award will be presented to young researchers or students who deliver an excellent oral presentation at the “Architectural Institute of Japan the Symposium on Computer Technology of Information, Systems and Applications (AIJISA).”
3. The award will be given to one in every ten participants, considering the balance of the research fields.
4. The award will be selected by a jury organized by the research committee on information systems technology at AIJ. The award winners will be recognized by the chair of the committee during the closing ceremony of AIJISA and will be publicly announced over a website.

### **PARTICIPANTS**

5. Young researchers or students who meet the following criteria may participate.
  - AIJ member
  - Under 30 years of age on the day of his or her oral presentation at AIJISA  
(Members aged 30 years or above may participate provided they are students.)
  - Not a past winner

## **THE JURY OF THE AIJISA YOUNG PRESENTATION AWARD**

(Formed by the committee on information technology at AIJ, August 8, 2019)

### **CHIEF JUROR**

1. The chief juror shall be commissioned by the chair of the research committee on information systems technology at AIJ.

### **JURORS**

2. The chief juror shall commission two jurors for every half day, and in every hall of the AIJISA.

### **EVALUATION**

3. The jurors will evaluate the participants based on evaluation criteria. By mutual agreement, they will recommend 10% of the participants as finalists to the chief juror. The evaluation criteria (maximum attribution score of 20 points) are as follows:
  - Comprehensibility of the presentation (maximum 5 points)
  - Quality of the presentation material (maximum 5 points)
  - Designated time limit of the presentation (maximum 5 points)
  - Efficient dealing of questions with logical explanation in question-and-answer session (maximum 5 points)

### **AWARD WINNERS**

4. The chief juror will select the award winners based on the jurors' recommendations and will report them to the chair of the committee. The chair generally approves the decision and reports it to the next commission.
