

REGULATIONS FOR THE AIJISA YOUNG PRESENTATION AWARD

(Formed by the Research Committee on Information Systems Technology of AIJ, Aug. 8, 2019)

(Revised by the Research Committee on Information Systems Technology of AIJ, Aug. 4, 2020)

OBJECTIVE

1. The aim of AIJISA Young Presentation Award is to acknowledge and encourage research in computer technology of information in architectural engineering.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

2. The award is for excellent oral presentation by young researchers or students at “Architectural Institute of Japan the Symposium on Computer Technology of Information, Systems and Applications (AIJISA)”.
3. The award is given to one participant in ten considering the balance of the research fields.
4. The award is selected by a jury organized in the research committee on information systems technology of AIJ. The award winners are recognized by the chair of the committee in the closing ceremony of AIJISA, and are publicly announced over a website.

PARTICIPANTS

5. Young researchers or students who meets the following conditions may participate.
 - AIJ member
 - Under 30 years old as of April 1 of the fiscal year
(Members of 30 years old and over may participate in the case of student.)
 - Other than past winners

THE JURY OF THE AIJISA YOUNG PRESENTATION AWARD

(Formed by the committee of information technology of AIJ, Aug. 8, 2019)

CHIEF JUROR

1. The chief juror of the jury of the AIJISA young presentation award shall be commissioned by the chairman of the research committee on information systems technology of AIJ.

JURORS

2. The chief juror shall commission 2 jurors for every half day, and every hall of AIJISA.

EVALUATION

3. The jurors evaluate participants thorough evaluation criteria. They recommend 10% of the participants as finalists to the chief juror by mutual agreement. The evaluation criteria (maximum attribution score of 20 points) are as follows:
 - Comprehensibility of the presentation (maximum 5points)
 - Quality of the presentation material (maximum 5points)
 - Time designation of the presentation (maximum 5points)
 - Act of questions and answers (maximum 5points)

AWARD WINNERS

4. The chief juror decides to select the award winners on the basis of juror's recommendations, and reports that to the chair of the committee. The chair generally approves the decision, and reports to the next commission.
